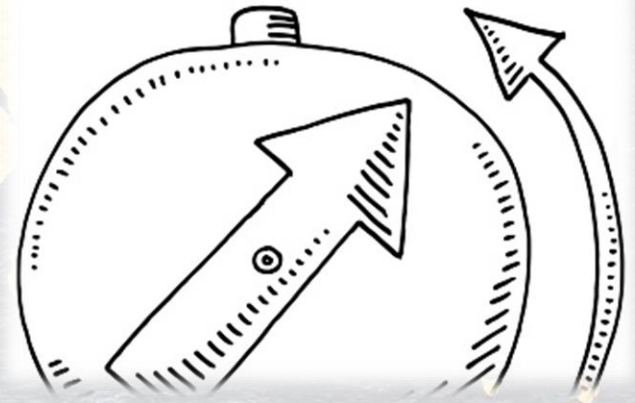
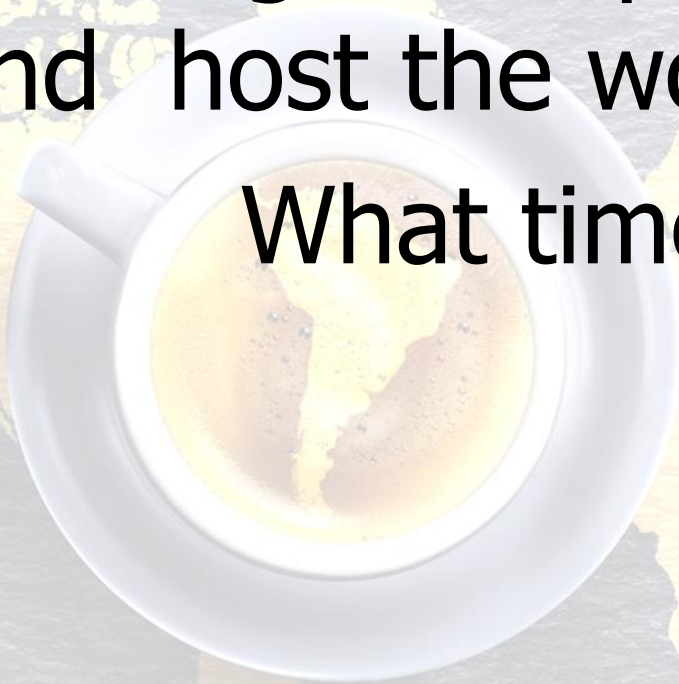

The right people will come



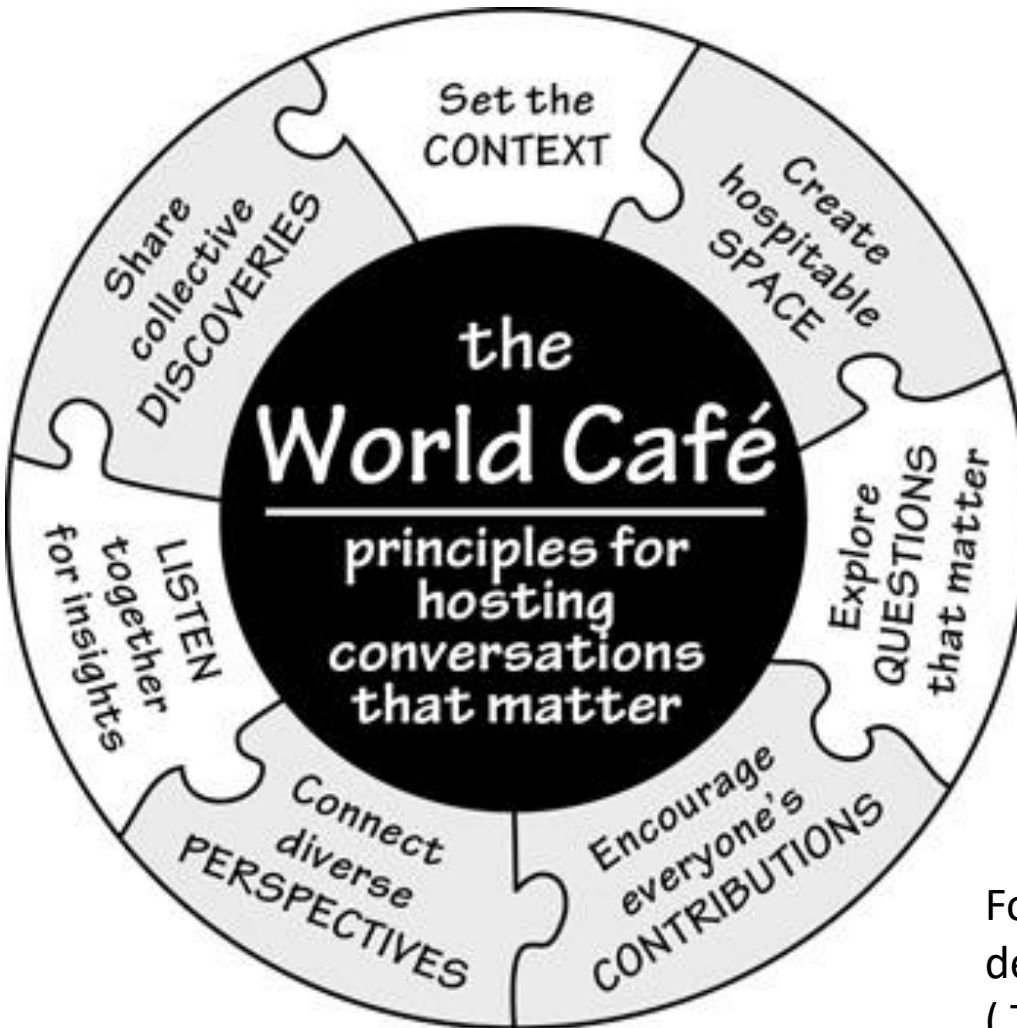

4. enjoy





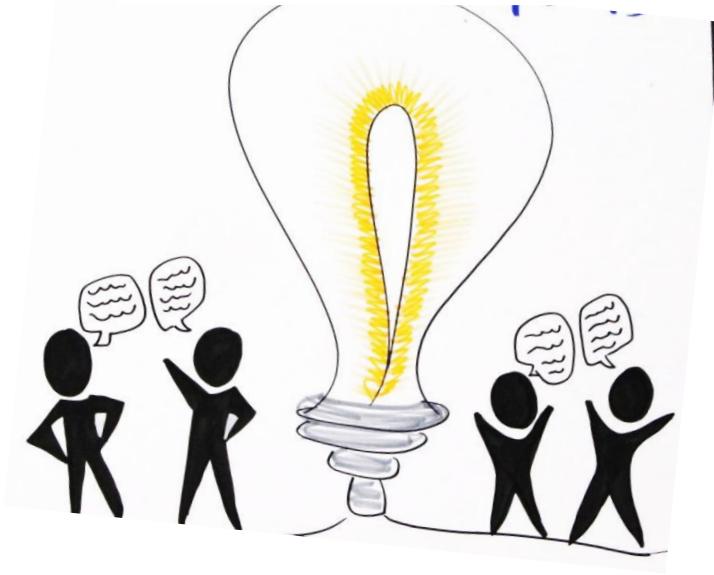
